We are delighted to have visitors worship with us, and we pray that you will be blessed through your participation in our services. In the Orthodox Church, the reception of Holy Communion is a mark of membership in the Church. Only those who have been united to the Orthodox Church through Baptism or Chrismation, having prepared themselves through regular CONFESSION, prayer and fasting, are permitted to partake of Holy Communion. We earnestly look forward to the day when unity in the faith, life and worship of all Christians will have been achieved. In the meantime, we encourage visitors to join with us in our prayers and hymns. Literature about the Orthodox faith and this parish can be found in the vestibule. Feel free to ask questions before or after the services and, if you like, sign our guest book and fill out a request card. Please join us for refreshments and fellowship in the Parish Center after Liturgy. We want our visitors who are not Orthodox to receive the blessed bread after the Liturgy and to venerate the Cross if you wish.

To prepare properly for holy communion, we should fast from food and drink from 12:00 at night until reception of communion. Exceptions are made for those who need food and drink to take medication and for other age related difficulties and infirmities. If you have any specific questions please see Fr. Anthony personally.

SUNDAY OF THE HOLY FATHERS

Gradual, Tone IV

You are blessed, O Lord, God of our forefathers.

Verse: For you have always dealt righteously with us.

Lesson from the Acts of the Apostles (c. 20, v. 16-18 28-36)

In those days, Paul decided to sail past Ephesus, as he did not want to be delayed in the province of Asia, for he was hurrying to be at Jerusalem, if possible on the day of Pentecost.

From Miletus he summoned the Presbyters of the Church of Ephesus. When they came, he said to them:

“Take care of yourselves and of all the flock, of which the Holy Spirit has made you Bishops. Guard the Church of God, which he has won for himself with his own blood. I know that after my departure

ferocious wolves will enter among you and they will not spare the flock. Even from among yourselves men will arise and teach perverse doctrines, in order to draw away the disciples after themselves.”

“Therefore, watch and remember that for three years, day and night, I never ceased to advise everyone of you with tears. Now I commend you to God and to his gracious Son, who can build you up and give you the inheritance among all the saints.”

“I have never coveted anyone’s gold, or silver, or clothes. You know well enough that these hands of mine have provided for my needs and my companions. I have always given you an example that by such hard work we must help our weak brethren. Remember the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, who said: ‘It is more blessed to give than to receive.’

With these words he knelt down and prayed with them all.

Gospel

John 17:1-13 (Holy Fathers)

The Reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. John

At that time: When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify thy Son that the Son may glorify thee, since thou hast given him power over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom thou hast given him. And this is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent. I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do; and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made.

"I have manifested thy name to the men whom thou gavest me out of the world; thine they were, and thou gavest them to me, and they have kept thy word. Now they know that everything that thou hast given me is from thee; for I have given them the words which thou gavest me, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from thee; and they have believed that thou didst send me. I am praying for them; I am not praying for the world but for those whom thou hast given me, for they are thine; all mine are thine, and thine are mine, and I am glorified in them. And now I am no more in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to thee. Holy Father, keep them in thy name, which thou hast given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. While I was with them, I kept them in thy name, which thou hast given me; I have guarded them, and none of them is lost but the son of perdition, that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

THERE ARE TIMES DURING ORTHODOX CHURCH SERVICES THAT CALL FOR THE PEOPLE TO KNEEL. EXAMPLES INCLUDE THE CONSECRATION OF THE HOLY GIFTS (“THINE OWN OF THINE OWN, WE OFFER UNTO THEE ON BEHALF OF ALL AND FOR ALL....”) AND DURING THE PRAYER OF ST. EPHRAIM DURING SERVICES IN GREAT LENT.

IF YOU ARE ABLE TO GET ONTO YOU KNEES, YOU SHOULD KNEEL.

IF YOU ARE NOT ABLE TO GET ONTO YOUR KNEES, IT IS PROPER TO REMAIN STANDING WITH YOU HEAD BOWED.

YOU SHOULD NOT SIT, EVEN IF YOU ARE ON THE EDGE OF THE SEAT WITH YOUR HEAD BOWED.

REMEMBER, SITTING IS NOT THE SAME AS KNEELING.
