In the Orthodox Church, the reception of Holy Communion is a mark of membership in the Church. Only those who have been united to the Orthodox Church through Baptism or Chrismation, having prepared themselves through regular CONFESSION, prayer and fasting, are permitted to partake of Holy Communion. We earnestly look forward to the day when unity in the faith, life and worship of all Christians will have been achieved. In the meantime, we encourage visitors to join with us in our prayers and hymns. Literature about the Orthodox faith and this parish can be found in the vestibule. Feel free to ask questions before or after the services and, if you like, sign our guest book and fill out a request card. Please join us for refreshments and fellowship in the Parish Center after Liturgy. We want our visitors who are not Orthodox to receive the blessed bread after the Liturgy and to venerate the Cross if you wish.

To prepare properly for holy communion, we should fast from food and drink from 12:00 at night until reception of communion. Exceptions are made for those who need food and drink to take medication and for other age related difficulties and infirmities. If you have any specific questions please see Fr. Anthony personally.

SUNDAY OF ALL THE SAINTS *Gradual, Tone VIII*

God is marvelous in his saints. *Verse:* Bless the Lord in the congregations.

Lesson from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Hebrews (c. 11, v. 33-39; c. 12, v. 1-2)

Brethren, all the saints through faith conquered kingdoms, lived righteously, received new promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, found strength in their time of trial, became mighty in war put foreign armies to flight.

Some returned to their women from certain death as if by resurrection. Some were tortured, but refused to accept their release, because they wanted to inherit a better life after their resurrection.

Others endured derision, floggings, chains, and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawed asunder, they were tortured, they were put to the sword. They went about in sheepskins, and goatskins, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated by the world, which was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts, in mountains, in caves, and in the holes of the earth.

Yet, all these martyrs, although well attested by their faith, have not obtained the divine promises. Because God had provided something better for all of us. He wanted us all to reach the fulfillment of our hopes together.

The Reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew

The Lord saith to his disciples: So every one who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven. He who loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and he who loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me and he who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Then Peter said in reply, "Lo, we have left everything and followed you. What then shall we have?" Jesus said to them, "Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of man shall sit on his glorious throne, you who have followed me will also sit on his twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And every one who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands; for my name's sake, will receive manifold, and inherit eternal life. But many that are first will be last, and the last first.

10.) At the Great Dismissal we say, "May He Who rose again from the dead, Christ our true God, through the intercessions of His all-immaculate and all-blameless holy Mother, ... Through the prayers...".

COMMUNION SEQUENCE

SITUATION: Observing the administration of communion in the following sequence will ensure efficient distribution of the Gifts and that everyone who desires communion will receive it an orderly manner.

1. DURING SUNDAY SCHOOL YEAR-Late August through May

Schedule will posted in July and August

2. SUMMER MONTHS--June through early August and when no Sunday School scheduled

Communion will be administered by alternating rows from the front of the church to the back of the church and directed by the ushers. Children stay with their parents and take communion with their parents. Choir members can proceed immediately to take communion so that they can return to the choir to complete the service.
