In the Orthodox Church, the reception of Holy Communion is a mark of membership in the Church. Only those who have been united to the Orthodox Church through Baptism or Chrismation, having prepared themselves through regular CONFESSION, prayer and fasting, are permitted to partake of Holy Communion. We earnestly look forward to the day when unity in the faith, life and worship of all Christians will have been achieved. In the meantime, we encourage visitors to join with us in our prayers and hymns. Literature about the Orthodox faith and this parish can be found in the vestibule. Feel free to ask questions before or after the services and, if you like, sign our guest book and fill out a request card. Please join us for refreshments and fellowship in the Parish Center after Liturgy. We want our visitors who are not Orthodox to receive the blessed bread after the Liturgy and to venerate the Cross if you wish.

To prepare properly for holy communion, we should fast from food and drink from 12:00 at night until reception of communion. Exceptions are made for those who need food and drink to take medication and for other age related difficulties and infirmities. If you have any specific questions please see Fr. Anthony personally.

5.) Epistle: Romans 5:1-10 (3rd Sunday after Pentecost)

THIRD SUNDAY

Gradual, Tone VI

The Lord is my strength and my glory.

Verse: The Lord has punished me severely, but he has not delivered me to death.

Lesson from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Romans (c. 5 v. 1-10)

Brethren, now that we have been justified by faith, we enjoy peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. For through him and through faith we have obtained access to this grace, in which we stand, and we exult in our hope of sharing the glory of God.

Not only that, but we also exult in our afflictions, because we know well that affliction produces endurance; and endurance produces steadfastness; and steadfastness produces hope; and hope will not disappoint us. For the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit, which has been given to us.

Now, while we were still reprobates, Christ in his own appointed time died for us sinners. A man would hardly give his life for a righteous person, though perhaps for a really good man someone will dare even to die.

But God showed his love for us by the fact that Christ died for us, while we were still sinners. So, now that we have been justified through his blood, it is far more certain that through him we shall be saved from the wrath of God.

For we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, when we were his enemies. Now that we are already reconciled to him, we are much more assured that we shall be saved through the life of his Son.

6.) Gospel: Matthew 6:22-33 (3rd Sunday of Matthew)

Matthew 6:22-33 (3rd Sunday of Matthew)

The Reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew

“The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light; but if your eye is unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then, the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!

‘No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.’” “Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, I or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you-you of little faith?

Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

8.) The Koinonikon: “Praise ye the Lord... Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia.”

9.) Post-Communion: “We have seen the true Light ...”, as usual. ONCE.

10.) At the Great Dismissal we say, “May Christ our true God, through the intercessions of His all-immaculate and all-blameless holy Mother, ... Through the prayers...”

COMMUNION SEQUENCE

SITUATION: Observing the administration of communion in the following sequence will ensure efficient distribution of the Gifts and that everyone who desires communion will receive it an orderly manner.

1. DURING SUNDAY SCHOOL YEAR-Late August through May

Schedule will posted in July and August

2. SUMMER MONTHS--June through early August and when no Sunday School scheduled

Communion will be administered by alternating rows from the front of the church to the back of the church and directed by the ushers. Children stay with their parents and take communion with their parents. Choir members can proceed immediately to take communion so that they can return to the choir to complete the service.
