Feel free to ask questions before or after the services and, if you like, sign our guest book and fill out a request card. Please join us for refreshments and fellowship in the Parish Center after Liturgy. We want our visitors who are not Orthodox to receive the blessed bread after the Liturgy and to venerate the Cross if you wish.

To prepare properly for holy communion, we should fast from food and drink from 12:00 at night until reception of communion. ### DIVINE LITURGY

1.) During the Little Entrance: The troparion of the Resurrection in Tone 3

#### **Tone 3**

The Resurrection from the Octoechos (Nassar, 154; Kazan Vesp., 165)

Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad; for the Lord hath done a mighty act with his own arm. He hath trampled down death and become First-born from the dead. He hath delivered us from the depth of hades, granting the world the Great Mercy.

2.) The Entrance Hymn(Eisodikon):

O come let us worship and fall down before Christ, O Son of God, who art risen from the dead, save us who sing unto thee: Alleluia

3.) After the Entrance we chant:

#### **Tone 3**

Grace has shone forth from thy mouth like fire, illuminating the inhabited world. Thou have treasured for the world the treasures of silver-hating and revealed to us the sublimity of humility. Wherefore, O Educator, by thy words, O John the golden-mouthed, intercede with Christ God to save our souls.

O Undisputed intercessor of Christians, the mediatrix unrejected by the Creator, turn not away from the voice of our petitions, though we be sinners. Come to us in time, who cry to thee in faith, with assistance; for thou art good. Hasten to us with intercessions O Theotokos, who dost ever intercede for those who honor thee.

5.) Epistle: Romans 6:18-23 (4th Sunday after Pentecost)

*FOURTH SUNDAY*

*Gradual, Tone III*

Sing praises to our God, sing praises to our King.

*Verse:* Clap your hands, all you nations.

Lesson from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Romans (c.6, V. 18-23)

Brethren, now you have been delivered from the bondage of sin and have become the servants of righteousness. I am using human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. In the past, you dedicated the members of your bodies to the service of impurity and to greater and greater iniquity. But now you have dedicated the members of your bodies to the service of righteousness and sanctification.

When you were the slaves of sin, you were free of the burdens of righteousness. But what benefit did you derive at that time from those practices, which now make you blush? Their result was death. However, now that you have been delivered from the bondage of sin and have become the servants of God, the benefit you derive is sanctification and the final result will be eternal life. The penalty of sin is death. But the gift of God is everlasting life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

6.) Gospel: Matthew 8:5-13 (4th Sunday of Pentecost)

**Gospel**

Matthew 8:5-13 (4th Sunday of Pentecost)

The Reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew

At that time: As Jesus entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him, beseeching him and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, in terrible distress." And he said to him, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion answered him, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I am a man under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, "Come," and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard him, he marveled, and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I say to you, with no one in Israel have I found such faith. I tell you, many will come from east and west and sit at table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, while the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness; there men will weep and gnash their teeth." And to the centurion Jesus said, "Go; be it done for you as you have believed." And the servant was healed at that very moment.

- 9.) Post-Communion: "We have seen the true Light ...", as usual. ONCE.
- 10.) At the Great Dismissal we say, "May Christ our true God, through the intercessions of His all-immaculate and all-blameless holy Mother, ... Through the prayers..."
